Peace and Social Justice Team Meeting — TODAY!

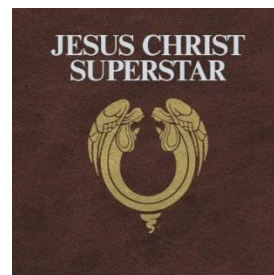

Semi Sing-A-Long! Second Sunday Cinema presents *Jesus Christ Superstar* (1973). This American musical drama film is based on the Andrew Lloyd Webber/Tim Rice rock opera.

The story is based largely on the Synoptic Gospels and Fulton J. Sheen's *Life of Christ*. However, greater emphasis is placed on the interpersonal relationships of the major characters, in particular, Jesus, Judas and Mary Magdalene, relationships that are not described in depth in the Gospels.

What most people remember from the movie, however, is the music. That's why we're presenting this movie as a semi-singalong with lyrics available to a few of the most popular numbers, including the title song and "I don't know how to love Him."

Unavoidable Hope: A Presentation by Dr. Roger Sabbadini — Thursday @ 6:30 PM
