Pentecost is a multi-faceted celebration – sometimes referred to as the birthday of the Church. Thank you, one and all, for coming to today's birthday party!

Added thanks for those who arrived wearing red this morning, recalling tongues of fire (from our first reading from the 2nd chapter of Acts)! That reading also speaks of how the Holy Spirit gave the disciples the ability to speak in various languages. So thanks, too, to those who have offered to read the first verses of that passage in another language (see page 6 for details). Based on those who have already signed up, we expect to hear a smattering of Spanish, French, Italian, German, Swedish, Russian, Latvian, Hawaii-Pidgin ... and more?!



The Holy Spirit is especially associated with baptism, so Pentecost is described as one of our “baptismal feast days.” This morning, we’ll celebrate the baptism of Robert Palmer Serrano at our 10:15 service ... and join in recalling the promises we all make on every baptismal occasion.
